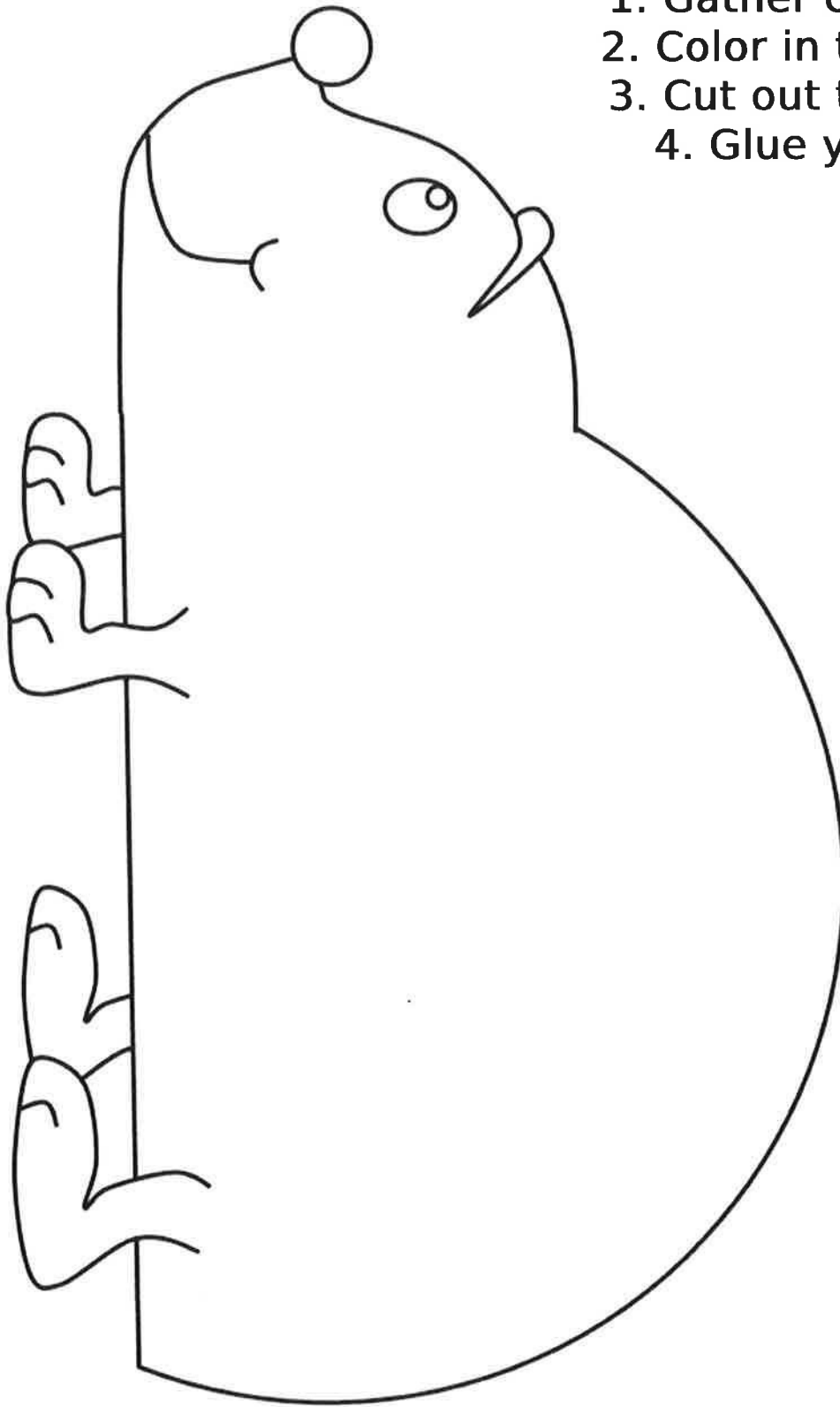

4. Glue your leaves on as "quills"



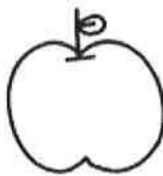
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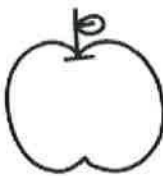
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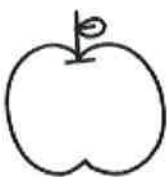

Peanut Butter and Jelly Spiders

Make these Halloween inspired PB & J Spiders in less than 5 minutes!

PREP TIME

5 minutes

TOTAL TIME

5 minutes

Ingredients

- 2 white/wheat bread slices
- 1 tbsp creamy peanut butter
- 1 tbsp grape jelly (or you choice of jelly)
- [8 thin pretzel sticks](#)
- [2 candy eyeballs](#)



Instructions

1. Using the lid of a mason jar or a round glass cup, carve out rounds into two slices of bread.
2. Spread an even layer of peanut butter across one of the bread rounds.
3. Spread an even layer of jelly across the other side of the bread round.
4. Place 4 pretzel sticks on each side, creating the spider legs.
5. Combine the two rounds together, covering the pretzels legs.
6. Add a tiny dot of peanut butter to the back of the two candy eyes to help them stick. Stick them onto the top layer of your peanut butter and jelly spider sandwich, creating the spider eyes.
7. Enjoy!

Notes

You can replace the candy eyeballs with raisins or mini chocolate chips.

Ingredients

- 1 apple
- jar of peanut butter (you will use about $\frac{1}{4}$ to a $\frac{1}{2}$ cup for one apple- depending on amount you put
- mini marshmallows

Instructions

1. First start by cutting the apple into slices. Then cut them into smaller slices.
2. Now you want to put about a teaspoon or two onto each slice.
3. Then put a row of mini marshmallows across one apple slice. Then sandwich them together. Press firmly until they stick and you have your teeth!

Halloween dates back to a pre-Christian Celtic festival called Samhain, which means "summer's end".

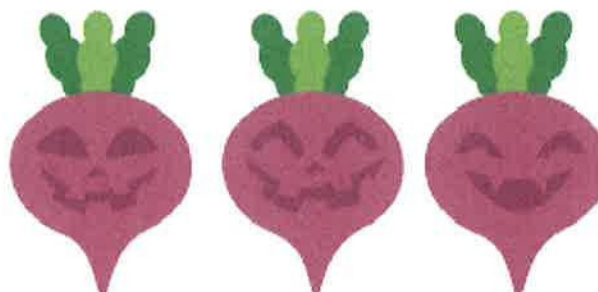


Halloween is older than you may think: it dates back to almost 2000 years ago!



Trick-or-treating has existed since medieval times, but it was known as "guising" or "souling" in Scotland and Ireland.

Jack-o'-lanterns were originally carved into turnips instead of pumpkins.



Halloween is the second-largest commercial holiday in the country, right after Christmas.



Candy corn was originally called Chicken Feed, not because it tastes like chicken food, but because corn is what was used to feed chickens.



The highest number of lit jack o'lanterns on display is 30,581 by the City of Keene, New Hampshire in 2013.

Americans spent approximately \$1.5 billion on Halloween that's a lot of candies and costumes!

The most popular children's costumes are princesses and superheroes.



Skittles are the top Halloween candy, even above M&M's, Snickers, and Reese's cups.



In Medieval Europe, owls were thought to be witches, and hearing an owl's call meant someone was about to die.



17% of Americans dress their pets in costumes - one of the most common costumes is pumpkins!



According to tradition, if a person wears his or her clothes inside out and then walks backward on Halloween, he or she will see a witch at midnight.



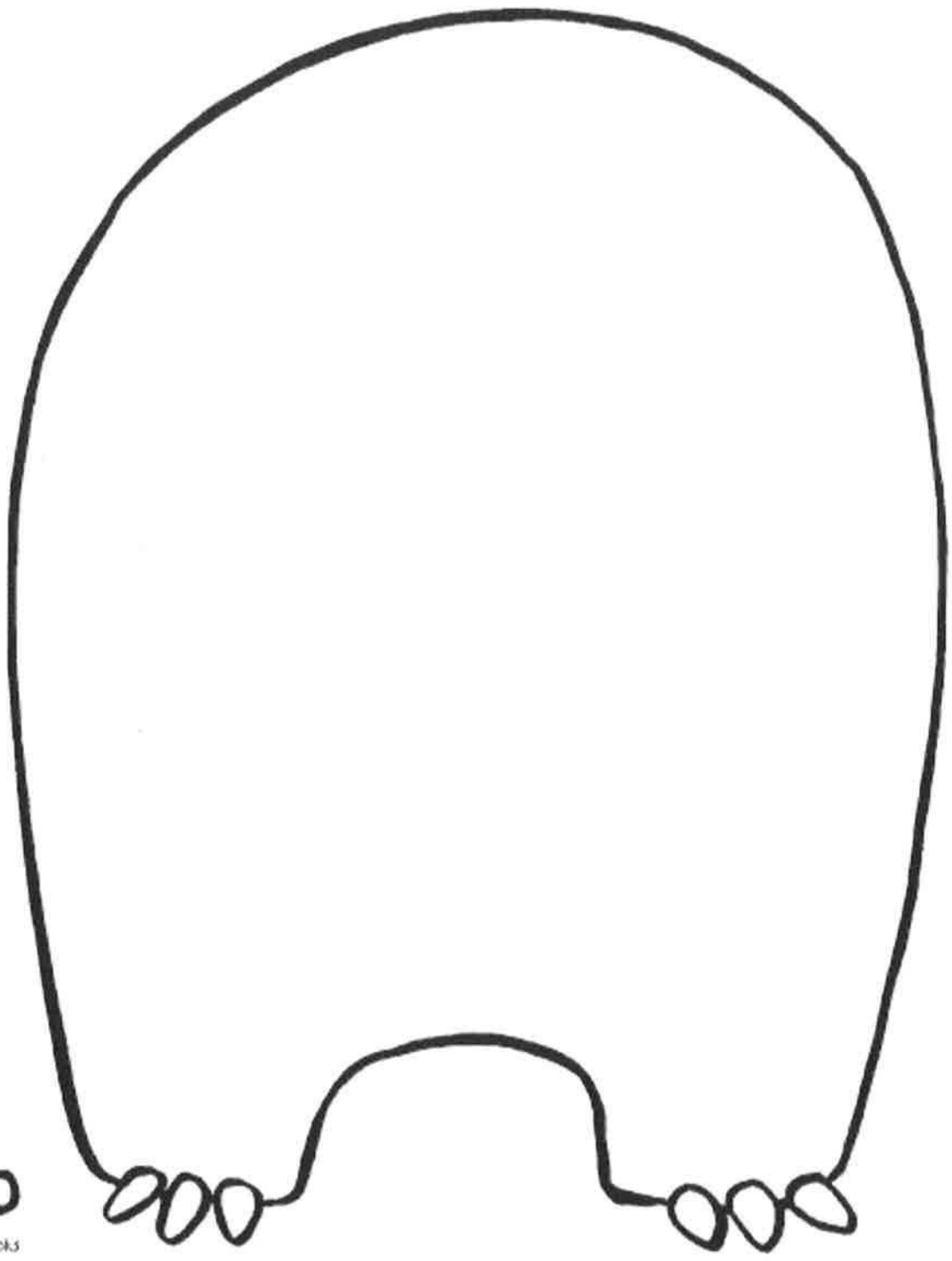
The night before Halloween is called Mischief Night or Goosey Night, mostly in the Midwest and on the East Coast.
